LA OFICINA PARROQUIAL

You've heard the saying "Seeing is believing." Today's first reading seems to say just the opposite. You might think that when Jesus rose from the dead, everyone would see him. Yet Peter says that he was only visible to some of the disciples. Even they did not immediately see him. The first thing they saw was the empty tomb, with burial cloths lying on the ground. They may have thought that if his enemies had stolen Jesus' body, they would not have removed the burial cloths; touching a corpse would have made them unclean. So it seems the empty tomb helped them to believe, and believing enabled them to see the Lord. The exception to this may be Thomas, who said he would not believe until he saw and touched Jesus' risen body. Yet when he does see the Lord, Jesus himself declares that believing is primary when he blesses those who have not seen but still believe (John 20:31). What does this mean for us? Jesus seems to be hidden again. Yet we say that he is present in the sacraments; Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation show that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit live in us. So perhaps we just need to believe in order to see him. Mother Teresa could do it. She said she was amazed at the love she felt when she saw Jesus in the poor and the dying people of Calcutta. Maybe we need to grow in faith so that we can see Jesus in the poor, the dying, the people who annoy us, even our enemies.



Han oído el dicho: "Ver para creer". La primera lectura de hoy parece decir todo lo contrario. Podríamos pensar que, cuando Jesús resucitó, todos lo verían. Sin embargo, Pedro dice que solo fue visible para algunos de los discípulos. Ni siquiera ellos lo vieron de inmediato. Lo primero que vieron fue la tumba vacía, con las telas funerarias en el suelo. Quizás pensaron que si sus enemigos hubieran robado el cuerpo de Jesús, no habrían quitado las telas funerarias, porque tocar un cadáver los habría vuelto impuros. Así que parece que la tumba vacía los ayudó a creer, y la fe les permitió ver al Señor. La excepción podría ser Tomás, quien dijo que no creería hasta que viera y tocara el cuerpo resucitado de Jesús. Sin embargo, cuando ve al Señor, Jesús mismo declara que la fe es lo primordial al bendecir a quienes no han visto pero creen (Juan 20,31). ¿Qué significa esto para nosotros? Jesús parece estar oculto de nuevo. Sin embargo, decimos que está presente en los sacramentos; el bautismo, la Eucaristía y la confirmación muestran que el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo viven en nosotros. Así que quizás solo tenemos que creer para verlo. La Madre Teresa pudo hacerlo. Dijo que estaba asombrada del amor que sentía al ver a Jesús en los pobres y los moribundos de Calcuta. Quizás necesitamos crecer en la fe para poder ver a Jesús en los pobres, los moribundos, las personas que nos molestan, incluso en nuestros enemigos.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Before the proclamation of the gospel at the Easter Vigil liturgy, there is a deeply powerful and moving moment. It is the joyous triple Alleluia. It not only signals the end of our penitential observances but it expresses our passage with the Lord through his passion, death, and burial. Alleluia is our joyful shout of triumph for as Christ rises from the dead, so do we.


Yet, we may find that our Easter joy has been dampened this year in the face of the daunting challenges of war, the upheavals experienced by migrant families, the great turbulence and polarization in our political life, and the myriad uncertainties about our future and the future of our children. Can we sing Alleluia and mean it?

Experiencing those sentiments myself I am drawn to Saint Paul's words to the Thessalonians. In a moment of suffering loss, confusion and grief he wrote: "But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died." (1Thessalonians 4:13-14)

Listen carefully to Paul's words. He tells the Thessalonians that they can grieve and that they can experience struggle and loss. But they must not grieve or suffer as those who have no hope, as those who do not believe that Jesus died and rose and will take us to himself. Like the Thessalonians, we do not ignore or deny the suffering and grief we are experiencing, but we are not held captive to this moment nor to this world. We hold fast to Christ our hope who draws us into a future defined and shaped by his Resurrection.

So, sisters and brothers, let's not hold back our shouts of joy. Let us sing with gusto our Alleluia for it bears witness to our enduring hope in Christ's Resurrection. It inspires us to do what we can to allow his risen life to take hold of and shape our lives and to empower us to reach out to our wounded world. A blessed Easter to all of you and your loved ones.

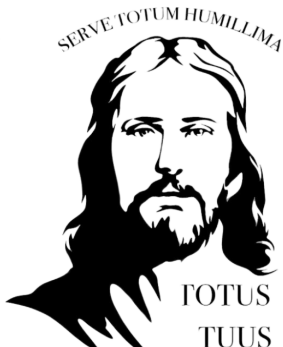
